OCCJ runs Anytown Leadership Institute, a summer leadership experience for high school **sophomores, juniors, and seniors** where students build an inclusive community, meet people from diverse backgrounds, and develop the skills to lead in a diverse society. Learn more and apply [here](#).



Youth Philanthropy Initiative is an intensive 3-year leadership program for **incoming freshmen or sophomores**. Cohorts of 25 students are provided with \$25,000 to use toward an issue facing teens which they feel is under-addressed. Learn more and apply [here](#).



Tulsa Public Schools runs City Lab, an educational job program that equips TPS **high school students** to identify real-world problems, propose solutions, and present ideas within a design thinking framework. City Lab takes place over spring break and summer vacation and provides opportunities for students to build leadership skills, engage creatively, and develop STEM practices with the goal to better prepare participants for the challenges of college, career, and young adult life. 




The City of Tulsa Mayor's Office runs Mayor's Youth Council, an opportunity for **high school students** to 1) learn about how local government works and how services are provided, 2) explore various city facilities and meet with key City staff and City officials, and 3) share their ideas about local government and local issues with City officials. Leadership Oklahoma runs a weeklong summer leadership program for high school students from across Oklahoma, learning learning lessons about leadership, trust, problem solving, communication, cooperation, career opportunities, and why Oklahoma is such a great place to live and work.
